



OUT ISLANDS UTILITIES ACT

INVESTMENT TYPE

Any person or developer who wishes to build a sewerage system or water supply system to be used by the public in any part of the Family Islands.

CONCESSIONS

- 1) Refund of all Import duties paid on all materials to be used for the construction, maintenance and operation of the utility system. The materials may be imported into The Bahamas, purchased or taken out of bond by the developer.

Materials

- Well casing, pipe work for use within well fields, well field pumps and the attendant electric motors, diesel or gasoline motors, windmills, electricity generating equipment
 - Electrical distribution works including poles, and cables, electrical ancillary equipment including controls, alarms, time switches and relays
 - Meters, gauges and other measuring equipment
 - Chlorinators, filters, siphon bridges and other water treatment and testing equipment
 - Fuel and lubricating oils
 - Pumps, motors, tanks of all kinds, screens, pipes, fittings, valves, pipe specials, hydrants, standpipes, pre-made valve, meter boxes, cocks, towers, trestles, manhole frames and covers, scrapers and other dosing treatment equipment, well drilling equipment, bricks, cement, aggregate, timber, reinforcing steel and other building materials
- 2) Other concessions the Minister responsible for utilities may consider are necessary given the nature and location of the sewerage system or water supply system.
